WHO IS A FIRE VOLUNTEER?

A FIRE volunteer is any community member with proficiency in English and a passion for helping build awareness of immigrant experience in our communities. A FIRE volunteer possesses patience, flexibility and a keen interest in supporting the wellness and educational needs of immigrant families.



TRAINING

We believe that a volunteer's professional development is critical to the success of our programs. FIRE is an associate program of the Minnesota Literacy Council (MLC) and encourages all potential volunteers to complete their 12-hour pre-service training in Literacy or ESL. Additionally, during their service, each volunteer is required to attend at least one of the MLC's in-service workshops to strengthen their skills. PARKING

WHAT IS FIRE?

ABOUT US

The Foundation for Immigrant Resources and Education (FIRE) was launched in 2004. FIRE is an adult literacy organization that offers English classes to non-native speakers. Driven by its core vision: *through literacy and community come empowered lives*, the mission of FIRE is to provide educational opportunities to adults seeking assistance; to facilitate in the development of literacy skills that are transferable to the everyday world; to foster critical thinking and creativity through participatory learning environments; and to provide opportunities for skill-sharing and awareness of immigrant experiences. FIRE classes welcome all adult learners who want to learn or improve their English, math, conversation and writing skills.

WHY ARE WE UNIQUE?

FIRE is the only 100% volunteer-run adult literacy program in the Twin Cities. Our well-trained team of educators is dedicated to serving the immigrant community, and working to personalize lessons to meet learners' needs. Our tutors are warm and approachable, and our excellent tutor-to-learner ratio allows us to spend more time with each learner.

FIRE's board of directors values learner feedback and meets regularly to discuss ways to strengthen our programs. Classes are held in the mornings and evenings in order to work around learners' schedules. FIRE is family friendly, and offers free evening childcare operated by children's literacy tutors.

QUALIFICATIONS

Classes are taught by volunteers trained by the Minnesota Literacy Council, or who have an advanced degree or certificate in Adult Education or ESL. FIRE volunteers also consist of non-teaching staff who assist the organization in various administrative and program support duties.

LENGTH OF COMMITMENT

FIRE conducts programming on a semester basis and follows the St. Paul Public School calendar. Volunteers are asked to commit to at least one three hour session for a full semester.

CONTRIBUTING TO FIRE

We rely on our volunteers to continually provide us with ideas, feedback, project concepts, and other resources to strengthen our organization. Tutors may supplement our core curriculum with a range of excellent resources from the tutor library. We encourage our tutors to supplement core textbooks together with activities, worksheets, dialogues, audio and visuals to create creative and engaging lessons. Learners progress more substantially and acquire useful skills when tutors have flexibility to make each lesson appropriate and interesting for their learners' needs and goals.



OUR LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

FIRE is a student-centered organization that values learner feedback on programming and curriculum. Learner input shapes and influences the decision making of FIRE's board. The board is composed of community members, learners and volunteers who often are actively involved in the day-to-day operations of FIRE.
